This camp is a Category 3 activity under BP & P Section 10000. A parent or guardian of all youth participants must therefore complete the [“Parent/Guardian Consent Form for Category Three Activities and Out of Country Travel”](#).

On the final request for registration, we will require for the following information:

Registered Members

1. The MMS number for each youth and adult
2. The name of each youth and adult.
3. Parent/Guardian Consent Form for each youth.
4. Leaders must ensure they have copies of the Program Participant Enrolment Form completed for the 2008-2009 year and carry them at all times while at and en route to and from this camp.
5. MCP Numbers
6. Allergy information
7. T-shirt sizes for youth and adult participants.
8. We will not require a fitness certificate for registered members.
9. Leaders are reminded that they should be familiar with Section 7000 ([Duty of Care](#)) and 10000 ([Camping and Outdoor Activities](#)) of BP & P.

ADULT HELPERS

(Non-Registered Adults)

In addition to the requirements below, all Groups must comply with all requirements of BP & P Section 3000 ([Membership and Registration](#)) in order to bring an adult who is not a registered Scouter to this camp. Non-registered adult helpers are not required to complete the “Individual Hold Harmless Agreement” set out in Section 13012.3 of BP & P, but must complete a [Physical Fitness Certificate for Non-Members](#) (BP & P [Section 20000](#)).

BP & P Section 3000 requirements include:

Non-Registered Adults assisting with on-Site Activity must

1. be given orientation to the role and expectations (job description, if available)
2. provide three personal references (to be checked by group)
3. provide a current Police Records Check
(to be filed at HQ before the adult can participate; allow six weeks for processing.)
4. be briefed by a group leader on the [Duty of Care](#) (BP & P 7000).
5. be introduced to youth and leaders and/or service staff.

Non-Registered Adults Accompanying their Child with Special Needs must

1. understand that the Parent/Guardian's sole responsibility lies with meeting the special needs of their own child and not supporting the Section's program activity.
2. be introduced to youth and leaders and/or service staff.
3. be briefed by a group leader on the [Duty of Care](#) (BP & P 7000).
